

Making a Difference A Mothers Love



Veronica has been working for a Fortune 100 company for over twenty-three years in upper management and has achieved numerous awards for her dedication to customer service. She is the Mother of three children, Johann Sebastian, Angeles Europa Cabada, an 18-year old wrestler, and Luis Enrique Cabada, 16 years old. With the passing of her first born, Johann Sebastian, Veronica has embarked on a journey to fight for victims' rights and be the voice for the unheard. Her personal story is inspirational; one of the trials, tribulations and TRIUMPH! A purposeful and gifted life teacher, she is passionate about helping those who are broken in spirtit. Her mission is to built the core of their existence through love and faith. Married for 15 years, they were together for a total of 20 years, and she had a fairy tale wedding. Divorce followed and she became lost and felt driven to succeed. The rest of her story is about the struggle to protect her son, Johann Sebastian.

When pregnant, she had to undergo emergency surgery and almost lost her own life. Her son, even at birth and during the pregnancy, was fighting for his life. Talk about the Power of Love, especially a Mother's Love, he overcame the obstacles and things were coming along. In the 4th grade, an illness overtook him. Doctor Canales, their wonderful physician referred them to another doctor. Her son would twitch and suffered childhood depression and anxieties. Classmates would laugh and tease, but because he also had many friends, it never crossed Veronica's mind he was being bullied. Teachers would write him up for making noises, which were part of his syndrome. The bullying continued.

In middle school, he was still suffering from his attacks physical, mental and emotional, but didn't tell Mom. He started smoking pot, dressing in dark colors and general was self medicating himself. All this was happening during the divorce. Veronica has a positive attitude and although it was challenging, as a single Mom, she researched for answers. Her Dad, Enrique, was supportive, and at the time she had two other children, ages 12 and 15 years old, to look after. Taking her son to a 90-day support group, she advises parents that support groups for kids are important.

In October 2011, he was dragged by a Mercedes Benz and suffered a broken collar bone, severe road rash throughout his body, and PTSD. Veronica's son survived after a stay in the hospital, but was suicidal. Going back and forth to the hospital was devastating. To see her boy, who was loving and giving, going through one thing after another was overwhelming. Upon making Johann's acquaintance, he would go straight to your heart. Veronica advises we must respect our children and be aware of what they are going through on a daily basis. "My son taught me so much; he went back to school and continued to fight. He eventually shared with me all that had happened to him and that he didn't want to live anymore." He spoke his piece and it gave him a measure of peace. Then he found out he was going to be a father. He passed away May 12th after taking a drug that ended his life. "I thank God I had my son for 17 years. It's about spirituality and his was a spiritual soul. He loved others for who they were, not how they looked, dressed or what they possessed financially."

The practice of bullying seems to be rampant in many high schools. There are untold numbers of adults who do not attend high school reunions 20, 30, or 50 years later because they have no happy memories of high school and don't care to renew acquaintance with those who made their lives miserable. That many remember it as the best times of their life, and others cringe at the remembrance, is



quite awful when you consider a little kindness would have made the difference in remembering. Bullying by any other name is simply an act of terrorism. Children are terrorized daily at school and even on the internet. It is evil and cruel. Nothing justifies the practice. If you possess self-esteem, you don't build yourself up and bolster your self confidence at another's expense. Bullying is ugliness personified, and there is really no place for it in a civilized society. If someone is different, thank God for the diversity in our humanity. If we were all the same, it would be unbearable. Respect yourself and others by being kind and generous in your thoughts and words. Don't extract pleasure from inflicting suffering on others. As stated above, bullying is actually a low act of terrorism.
