whose professional name is Ara Celi - to speak at Eastwood High School.

"We've gone to a lot of places giving these presentations," said Sal Montelongo, the director of Lucid Love. "We've talked to what some people say are the worst kids in El Paso and they have responded favorably. We didn't know how many kids needed this type of program, but everywhere we go, our message seems to effect them. Who knows what they are going through. They're scared and have no one to turn to."


Cabada maintains her son was bullied throughout his school years and finally hit its peak on Oct. 22, 2011. That's when Sebastian, then a sophomore at Coronado High School, was seriously injured after a fellow student inside a car grabbed his arms and held on to him as the car sped off, dragging him at a high rate of speed.

Medical records show he suffered cuts and bruises on his legs, skin burns on his back, a broken collar bone and damage to the frontal lobe. He also suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder.

"Our mission statement is building the core of our existence through love and faith," Cabada said while sitting in her son's room. "I could have turned this horrific incident into something ugly. I could have been an angry, bitter mother and inflicted more harm and anger."

"But I didn't want to do that because there is enough of that in this world already," she said. "I wanted to turn it around and do something positive, to give people help and to let people know that there is someone out there they can totally empathize

Lucid Love originated in October 2014, after one of the defendants in the dragging case pleaded guilty to assault with bodily injury. He was given deferred ad-

"To the bullies. I challenge them to stop and to say sorry to the person they have bullied," Cabada said

"To the bystanders, I ask them, 'Don't just stand there and video tape and put it on Facebook or You-Tube, do something to stop it," she said. "Bullving is wrong, it hurts, it's traumatic and it stays with you forever."

She said telling Sebastian's story is therapeutic.

"It is my obligation," she said. "I always thought I was his teacher, but in reality, he was mine. He taught me so much. It is difficult to find another human being with his spirit. He even forgave those who bullied him."
